PARISH GIVING: Last weekend our bulletin explained on the "feature page" the meaning and purpose of Parish Giving (Electronic Giving). Parish Giving is a program which allows parishioners to donate on a one-time basis or a recurring contribution (Sunday to Sunday). Contributions are directly withdrawn from either your checking or saving account or can be charged to your credit card. This program can be utilized for your Sunday offering, as well as any Holy Day Collection and all Archdiocesan collections. It can also be used for donations towards the Annual Appeal and Parish Debt. Basically, anything you would like to donate towards can be done through Parish Giving. Registrations and all transactions are free! Parish Giving gives you flexibility to choose where you want contributions to go and when and how you want them to be made. You have access to view or make updates on your account 24/7. It allows you the freedom of not having to worry about envelopes, checkbooks or making up your contributions when you are away from home. It's already taken care of! Parish Giving is very user friendly. It's as easy as 1-2-3! 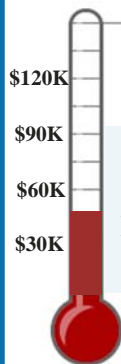


CONDOLENCES....

Pilgrim Virgin Enthronement: Taking a statue of the Virgin Mary from home-to-home to people who have signed up to receive her, and saying prayers with them.

Making Cards and Rosaries: To be shared with those we meet and distributed during other legionary activities including St. Mary Day Celebration and Schwenksville Community Day.

Evangelization: Giving out sacramentals and literature at fairs, bazaars and other places alongside Senior Legionaries.

Teaching PREP: Being an aide or teacher of PREP.

The Legion is an extension of the heart and hands of the pastor.

All Junior Legion activities are supervised directly by adults who are completely cleared and trained within the Safe Environment Policy. Parents are welcome to attend meetings & participate.

HOW DO I JOIN THE JUNIOR LEGION OF MARY?

The Junior Legion of Mary is open to all Catholic youth between the ages of 8 and 17.

Members meet every Saturday at 11:40 AM in St. Mary's Annex for prayer, planning and discussion in a family setting.

Juniors will complete one hour of work each week in pairs under the guidance of their Spiritual Director.

Members visit two nursing homes on the weekends to share God's love with the residents:

- ✦ Frederick Living on Saturday from 9:30 - 11:00 AM
- ✦ Greenfield on Sunday at 9:30 - 10:30 AM.
